Exciting Racing, DTHA Events and News!

What a difference a day makes! July brought us much excitement and many changes. Who knows, maybe it was the "Blue Moon" this month, but here is the scoop.

July 17 and 18, Delaware Park hosted its festival of racing. On Saturday, July 17, the finish of the \$100,000 R.R.M. Carpenter, Jr. Memorial Handicap was only separated by three necks. ANGELA AURA finished a neck in front for local trainer Steve Klesaris and just behind THE LADY'S GROOM for our other local

trainer Michael Gorham. Next came the 3-year-old fillies 43rd running of the Delaware Oaks. Favorite YEARLY REPORT shipped in to win for trainer Bob Baffert, owner Golden Eagle Farm and jockey Jerry Bailey.

The Robert G. Dick Memorial Breeders Cup was also another close finish. It ran at 1 3/8m on the turf. Favorite ALTERNATE hung on to win by a head for local connections Graham Motion and leading rider Ramon Dominguez. LADY OF THE FUTURE came flying late to just miss for local trainer Tom Greene.

ESPN televised live on Sunday in the pouring rain as part of its "Racing to the Breeders Cup" show. The rain was less than cooperative and the sloppy track forced the Light Hearted Handicap to scratch down to three and ex-claimer NICLIE beat out odds-on-favorite BRONZE ABE by 2 1/4 lengths. The Cape Henlopen race was taken off the turf and also scratched down to three starters and was won by CHOPPER WON. Next, the Grade III Leonard Richards for three-year-olds was won by Kentucky Derby starter and favorite POLLARDS VISION.

The rain finally subsided for the 69th running of the Delaware Handicap. SUMMER WIND DANCER traveled 3,000 miles to make her first start outside of California a winning one for trainer Jeff Mullins, owners Linda Vetter and Richard and Yvette Wira and jockey Victor Espinoza. Another shipper, ROAR EMOTION,

finished 2nd and local contender MISTY SIXES finished third for Steve Klesaris.

It's now time to prepare for our next big event – Owners Day – so clear your calendars for Saturday, September 11, 2004. We graciously ask that you refrain from taking balloons and decorations until AFTER the last race as we had several complaints in the past that horses were being spooked in the paddock and while walking over for their race. All flowers on the tables will be donated to local nursing homes. We hope you have a great day of racing and fun.

On September 13, 2004 ballots for our next election will be mailed. They are due back by October 4th. Results will be announced October 11th. On October 18th, the new board will officially take office and the DTHA October board meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, October 19th. This year we are losing several valuable board members, so please be sure to read the bios and make your selections thoughtfully.

Substance-free Housing Partnership

Delaware Park recently marked the opening of a new substance-free bunkhouse on the backstretch of the Stanton, Delaware track. The facility is one of twelve new housing units for seasonal employees.

Participants at the ribbon-cutting event included, left to right, Pete Alexander, President of the Delaware Horsemen's

Assistance Fund; Wesley Jones, a certified counselor and coordinator of the Backstretch Employment Assistance Fund; Herb Moelis, President of Thoroughbred Charities of



America, donor of a grant to furnish the bunkhouse; and Bill Fasy, Chief Operating Officer of Delaware Park, who built the bunkhouse.

The new living quarters can accommodate up to 11 persons "who have established sobriety and want a supportive environment during the meet," said Wesley Jones. The substance-free housing and counseling program are modeled after the successful "BEAT Program" at Belmont Park in Elmont, New York.

The substance-free counseling program, together with a backstretch wellness clinic and recreational activities, are provided through the Delaware Horsemen's Assistance Fund (DHAF) a partnership between Delaware Park and the Delaware Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association. The DHAF was established in 1966 "for the benefit, aid, assistance and relief of horsemen, trainers, exercise riders, grooms and stable attendants."
